The Program Coordinator should be knowledgeable about the population, specifically African immigrant men, and comfortable talking about HIV, including related subjects. The Program Coordinator should be well organized, flexible to work nights and weekends (when needed) and able to work independently and on a team. Willingness and ability to drive to program-related activities on a weekly basis is necessary.
